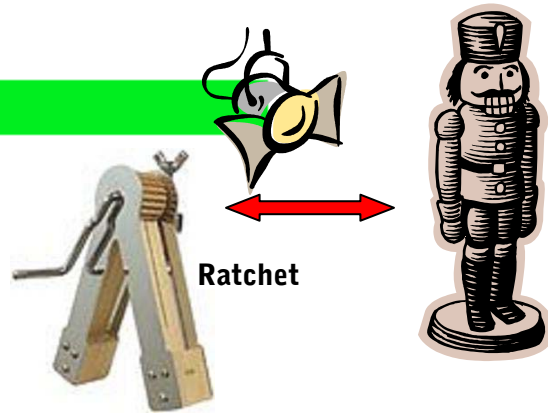


SPOTLIGHT ON The Percussion Family



Snare Drum



Ratchet

There are many instruments in the **PERCUSSION** family. They are anything you can hit with your hand, a mallet, or stick. A great example is the snare drum. See how in the picture above the snare drum is being hit with the drumsticks?



Some **PERCUSSION** instruments you will hear in the *Nutcracker for Kids* concert are the ratchet, tambourine, harp, and celeste. You might not think of the harp as a part of the **PERCUSSION** family because the harp player does not use mallets to play the instrument. As you can see in the picture above, the harpist uses her fingers to pluck the strings! The celeste is a small piano-like keyboard instrument that sounds like little tinkle bells. Can you guess what character in the ballet has music played by the celeste? You will have to come to the concert to find out!

The ratchet has a special role in your concert. It is the instrument that makes the sound of the Nutcracker.
