ABOUT THE ARTISTS



Ronald Banks, emcee and bass-baritone, is pleased to return to Pacific Symphony, having performed as the Percussionator in the Superheroes! Family concert and as Grandpa in the Class Act tribute concert to Leonard Bernstein. Banks has been seen on stages around the

world across a 30-year career. A versatile performer, his talents included work in musical theatre, opera, oratorio, voiceover and in recital. Operatic roles include Rigoletto, Sharpless in Madame Butterfly, Don Pasquale and many others. He has worked with Los Angeles Chamber Singers, La Jolla Symphony, San Diego Symphony and many other chorales and orchestras around the world. His solo credits include: Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, Messiah, A German Requiem and The Creation. In musical theater, Banks is best known for his portrayal of the King of Siam in The King and I, a role which he has performed more than 500 times, garnering awards and critical acclaim in productions across the nation. Other award-winning roles include King Arthur in Camelot and the title role in Sweeney Todd, for which he received a ReviewPlays.com nomination for Best Performance and a Garland Award Honorable Mention. Banks has been seen in Pacific Overtures, as Peron in Evita, Chao in the Broadway-bound revival of Flower Drum Song, Emile Debecque in South Pacific and recently finished an eightyear run as Jafar in Aladdin: A Musical Spectacular at the Disneyland Resort. Bank's distinctive speaking voice can be heard as multiple characters in the World of Warcraft and Mortal Kombat video games.



Lyric Soprano Yunah Lee is thrilling audiences in the U.S., Europe and Asia with her "handsomely colored full lyric sound" (Opera News) and "picture perfect" acting (Berkshire Fine Arts). "Lee deservedly earned the most vociferous ovation of the [Glimmerglass] festival as the

audience leapt to their feet as one to roar their approval at her curtain call" (*Opera Today*). "[Director Francesca Zambello's] ability to get the voices she wanted is abundantly clear, especially with Korean-born lyric soprano Yunah Lee in the title role" (*Syracuse New Times*). "Lee is one of the world's leading interpreters of the role. It's hard to imagine a more nuanced, yet powerful delivery of this music..." (*The Salt Lake Tribune*).



Tenor Nicholas Preston has been praised by the Orange County Register as being "resonant and warm" and by the classical music site Bachtrack as "a ringing stentorian tenor." This Hawai'i native is in demand as a soloist in Southern California and beyond, having performed

throughout California and touring as a soloist in France, Italy and Spain. He has been a member of Pacific Chorale since 2002 and has frequently appeared as a soloist with the ensemble. Preston has also performed as a soloist with the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra, Claremont Chorale, Santa Maria Philharmonic Society, Cypress Masterworks Chorale and The Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra. He has worked under the batons of John Alexander, Carl St.Clair, Keith Lockhart, John Williams, Nicholas McGegan, Kent Nagano, John Mauceri, Esa-Pekka Salonen, Grant Gershon and Gustavo Dudamel.



Pianist Fei-Fei Dong is a winner of the Concert Artists Guild Competition and a top finalist at the 14th Van Cliburn International Piano Competition. Praised for her "bountiful gifts and passionate immersion into the music she touches" (The Plain Dealer), she continues to build a reputation

for her poetic interpretations, charming audiences with her "passion, piquancy and tenderness" and "winning stage presence" (Dallas Morning News), both in the U.S. and internationally, including her native China. Career highlights include performances with the Fort Worth Symphony, Kansas City Symphony, Buffalo Philharmonic, Calgary Philharmonic, Aspen Music Festival Orchestra, Spokane Symphony, Corpus Christi Symphony, Austin Symphony, Denver Philharmonic, Anchorage Symphony, Youngstown Symphony and the Juilliard Orchestra. Internationally, she has performed with Canada's Calgary Philharmonic, Germany's Rostock and Baden-Baden philharmonic orchestras, and in China with the Hong Kong Philharmonic, China National and Shenzhen Symphony orchestras. Fei-Fei was showcased prominently as a Cliburn finalist in the documentary film, Virtuosity, about the 2013 Cliburn Competition, which premiered on PBS in August 2015. 🦱



Guzheng Master Bei Bei Monter was born in Chengdu, China and trained at China Central Universities of Nationalities in Beijing and Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts under several Guzheng masters. As a recording artist, her performances have

been featured in Disney's live-action *Mulan* film in 2020, Sci-fi Channel's *Battlestar Galactica*, award-winning video game *Revelation*, and most recently, at the new Universal Studios Beijing theme park. In 2015, she was featured as one of "The Most Fascinating People of Los Angeles" by *LA Weekly Magazine*. Bei Bei has released four albums and was featured in many artists' songs such as *Loyal Brave True* by Christina Aguilera as well as *Yue Dao Tian Xin Chu* by Summer Jike Junyi. She has performed throughout the U.S. and Canada, and toured to Hong Kong, India, the U.K. and Italy. She was also featured as a guest soloist performing with UC Irvine Symphony orchestra, UCLA Game Music Ensemble and Pacific Symphony. Bei Bei's multiple performance videos on YouTube have been viewed over 12 million times in total. Her fans are all over the world.



Vocalist Bích-Vân Nguyen was trained at the National Music Conservatory in Vietnam and at Bob Cole Conservatory of Music, Cal State Long Beach. She recently graduated with a Masters in Musical Theater at New York University. One of the most sought-after Vietnamese

vocalists in her genre, she has performed as a soloist with Asia Entertainment, the Vietnamese–American Philharmonic, the Ngan Khoi Chorus and more. She has also performed in opera, musical theater and stage productions, concerts over the world at prestigious venues such as National Music Conservatory in Vietnam, Kennedy Center, the Rainbow Room at Rockefeller Center, Carpenter Performing Arts Center, La Mirada Theater, Rachel Schlesinger Concert Hall (Va.) and Marie Stéphane Concert Hall (Montreal). Notable roles include the roles of Kim in Miss Saigon, Christine in Phantom of the Opera, Cleopatra in Handel's Giulio Cesare and Nannetta in Falstaff, among others.

her students have participated and won many awards in several national and international dance competitions. In 2014, New Drum Rhythms, the dance produced in her academy won the "All-Star" honor at China Central Television Dance World. In 2015, as an independent artist, she created and performed her contemporary work Gravid at the LATC Dance Festival. In 2018, Yaya Zhang became a founding member of International Music and Dance Festival, and worked together with Claire Trevor School of the Arts of UCI on an east-west cultural exchange project called East Meets West.



Guest Dancer Bianca Bulle began her ballet training on the Gold Coast at The Ransley Ballet & Performing Arts Studio. At the age of 16, she moved to New York City to train at The School of American Ballet. After two years of professional training,

her ballet career began when she started dancing with The Los Angeles Ballet. She was promoted to Principal Dancer in 2017, and during her career with LAB, she danced many of the classical works like Odele/Odette in Swan Lake and The Sylph in La Sylphide as well as many Balanchine ballets such as Rubies, Concerto Barocco and Agon. Bianca joined The Miami City Ballet in 2019 where she danced principal roles such as Aria 1 in George Balanchine's Stravinsky Violin Concerto. She has since retired from dancing with a professional company to dance as a quest artist.



Guest Dancer Yana Zhao graduated from Beijing Dance Academy. She started dancing at age seven. She was professionally trained in ballet, Chinese classic dance, modern dance and jazz for 12 years at Guangdong Dance and Drama College and Beijing Dance

Academy. Zhao has been an actress and dancer of Beijing Guo Lun Novel Arts Center and China National Theatre for Children after she received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree. Since then, she focuses on dance education and choreography.



Sam Wei-Chih Sun, Director of American Feel Young Chorus, is a pianist, accompanist and music educator. His interest in music was encouraged by his mother at age 6, when he started playing the piano. He attended the Taipei Municipal Teachers College and majored in piano

performance and minored in cello and vocal performance.

After graduation, Sun became an elementary school music teacher in Taipei and held many musical activities to inspire students' interests in music. In 2005, Sun received a master's degree in conducting from Azusa Pacific University. Sun is an adjunct professor of piano at Azusa Pacific University, Citrus Community College and Calvin Chao Theological Seminary. He is the music director at Good Shepherd Taiwanese Presbyterian Church in Monterey Park. He also conducts the Southern California Taiwanese Hakka Chorus, the Arcadia Chinese Chorus and the Irvine Chinese Chorus.



Robert Istad, who "fashions fluent and sumptuous readings" (Voice of OC) with his "phenomenal" artistry (Los Angeles Times), was appointed Pacific Chorale's artistic director in 2017. Under his leadership, the chorus

continues to expand its reputation for excellence for delivering fresh, thought-provoking interpretations of beloved masterworks, rarely performed gems and newly commissioned pieces. His artistic impact can be heard on two recent recordings featuring Pacific Chorale: "Mahler's Eighth Symphony" with the Los Angeles Philharmonic conducted by Gustavo Dudamel on Deutsche Grammophon (2021), for which he prepared the chorus, and "All Things Common: The Music of Tarik O'Regan," which he conducted, on Yarlung Records (2020). Istad has also prepared choruses for such renowned conductors as Esa-Pekka Salonen, John Williams, John Mauceri, Keith Lockhart, Nicholas McGegan, Vasilly Sinaisky, Sir Andrew Davis, Bramwell Tovey, Carl St.Clair, Eugene Kohn, Giancarlo Guerrero, Marin Alsop, George Fenton, and Robert Moody. He regularly conducts and collaborates with Pacific Symphony, Musica Angelica Baroque Orchestra, Sony Classical Records, Yarlung Records, Berkshire Choral International and Long Beach Symphony. An esteemed educator, Istad is professor of music and director of choral studies at California State University, Fullerton, where he was recognized as CSUF's 2016 Outstanding Professor of the Year. He conducts the University Singers and manages a large graduate conducting program, in addition to teaching courses on conducting and performance practice. Istad, who is on the executive board of directors of Chorus America and serves as Dean of Chorus America's Conducting Academy, is in demand as guest conductor, lecturer and clinician.

PACIFIC CHORALE

PACIFIC CHORALE, an Orange County "treasure" with a "fresh viewpoint" that "can sing anything you put in front of it, with polish, poise and tonal splendor" (Orange County Register) has "risen to national prominence" (Los Angeles Times) since its inception in 1968. Hailed for delivering "thrilling entertainment" (Voice of OC), the resident choir at Segerstrom Center for the Arts is noted for its artistic innovation and commitment to expanding the choral repertoire. It has given world, U.S. and West Coast premieres of more than 35 works, including numerous commissions, by such lauded composers as John Adams, Jake Heggie, James Hopkins, David Lang, Morten Lauridsen, Ravel, Tarik O'Regan, Karen Thomas, Frank Ticheli, András Gábor Virágh and Eric Whitacre. In addition to presenting its own concert series each season, Pacific Chorale enjoys a long-standing partnership with Pacific Symphony, with whom the choir made its highly anticipated Carnegie Hall debut in 2018. The chorus also regularly appears with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and has performed with such leading orchestras as the Boston Symphony, National Symphony, Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, San Diego Symphony and Musica Angelica, among others. Pacific Chorale has garnered international acclaim as well, having toured extensively to more than 19 countries in Europe, South America, and Asia, and through collaborations with the London Symphony, Munich Symphony, L'Orchestre Lamoureux and L'Orchestre de St-Louis-en-l'Île of Paris, National Orchestra of Belgium, China National Symphony, Hong Kong Sinfonietta, Estonian National Symphony, and Orquesta Sinfónica Nacional of Argentina, among others. Deeply committed to making choral music accessible to people of all ages, the organization, which has a discography of 14 self-produced recordings and an extensive collection of exceptional free digital offerings, places a significant emphasis on choral music education, providing after-school vocal programs for elementary school students, a choral summer camp for high school students, and an annual community-wide singing event at Segerstrom Center for the Arts.
