ABOUT THE ARTISTS





Organist Todd Wilson is regarded across America and around the world as one of today's finest concert organists. He serves as head of the Organ Department at The Cleveland Institute of Music, and is also Director of Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Cleveland, Ohio and Curator of the E.M. Skinner pipe organ at

Severance Hall (home of The Cleveland Orchestra). Todd Wilson has been heard in recital at many major venues the United States, Europe, and Japan, including Symphony Hall (Birmingham, U.K.), Westminster Abbey (London, U.K.), St. Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin (Ireland), Los Angeles' Walt Disney Concert Hall, Chicago's Orchestra Hall, Cleveland's Severance Hall, Dallas' Meyerson Symphony Center, Philadelphia's Verizon Hall, Nashville's Schermerhorn Symphony Center, Milwaukee's Uihlein Hall, Washington National Cathedral, St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York City, and the 21,000-seat Mormon Conference Center in Salt Lake City. He also was a recitalist for Austrian Radio in Vienna, and in January 2005 presented his first solo recital in Tokyo, Japan. Wilson has appeared with many symphony orchestras around the world including the Cleveland Orchestra, the Los Angeles Philharmonic for whom in 2004 he was featured organ soloist on the first orchestra subscription series concerts featuring the new Walt Disney Concert Hall organ, the Nashville Symphony, the Slovakian Radio Symphony Orchestra, the Naples (Florida) Philharmonic, and The City of London Sinfonia. An active member of the American Guild of Organists, Wilson holds the Fellow and Choirmaster certificates from that institution, and won the S. Lewis Elmer Prize for the highest national exam score in 1982. He has been a featured recitalist at many Guild conventions including national conventions in 1992 (Atlanta), 1996 (New York City), 2008 (Minneapolis), 2012 (Nashville), and 2018 (Kansas City).



Barry Perkins has been Principal Trumpet of Pacific Symphony since 2004. He holds the Susie and Steve Perry Chair. Throughout his career, he has performed with many worldrenowned orchestras, famous classical and jazz artists, as well as esteemed conductors. When he was in his early 20s, Perkins held the position

of Associate Principal Trumpet of the Mexico City Philharmonic for 5 years. Since then he has also performed with the San Diego Symphony, San Diego Opera, Baltimore Symphony, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. In addition to his live orchestra career, Perkins is an active Hollywood studio musician.



Elliott Moreau has been a member of the Pacific Symphony since 2005 and Principal Bassoon with Opera Pacific since 2006. He holds degrees from DePaul University (B.Mus.) the University of Southern California (M.M.) and has, in addition, participated in a Professional Studies program at Temple University. Among

his teachers have been Bill Buchman (Chicago Symphony), Stephen Maxym (former member of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra), and Daniel Mastukawa (Philadelphia Orchestra). A former member of the Haddonfield (NJ) Symphony, he has performed with the New World Symphony and with many of the leading orchestras in Southern California and acted as Principal Bassoon for American Ballet Theatre and St. Petersburg Ballet during their local tours.



Dennis Kim has been Concertmaster of Pacific Symphony since September 2018. He holds the Eleanor and Michael Gordon Chair. A citizen of the world, Kim was born in Korea, raised in Canada and educated in the United States. He has spent more than a decade leading orchestras in the United States, Europe, and

Asia. Most recently, he was Concertmaster of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra in New York. He was first appointed Concertmaster of the Tucson Symphony Orchestra at the age of 22. He then served as the voungest concertmaster in the history of the Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, before going on to lead the Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra and the Tampere Philharmonic Orchestra in Finland.



Violinist Jennise Hwang, a Los Angeles native and Colburn School alumna, joined the Pacific Symphony in 2017. A seasoned soloist and chamber musician, Hwang has claimed prizes in prestigious competitions like SYMF and Korea Times. She completed her Bachelor's at Northwestern University, where she was

concertmaster and won the Northwestern Concerto Competition. Her performance at the Kennedy Center highlighted her undergraduate achievements. Hwang earned her Master's at New England Conservatory, collaborating with ensembles like Boston Philharmonic and A Far Cry. Prior to Pacific Symphony, she enriched the New World Symphony as a fellow and educator. Hwang's notable instructors include Nick Kitchen and Michelle Kim, and she has performed at festivals such as Tanglewood and Spoleto.



Meredith Crawford won her first orchestral audition and a seat with Pacific Symphony at the age of 22-before the completion of her senior year at Oberlin Conservatory. In September 2012, she was awarded the position of Assistant Principal Viola and five years later, she won her current position with the

orchestra as Principal Viola. She holds the Catherine and James Emmi Chair. Additionally, she has been performing with the Los Angeles Philharmonic since April 2010, and more recently with the Riverside Philharmonic (as principal viola), the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, and Irvine's Mozart Classical Orchestra.



Cellist Benjamin Lash leads a vibrant career as a soloist, chamber musician, orchestral player, studio musician, and educator. He was a top prizewinner in the Washington International Competition and has performed concertos with orchestras in both the Chicago and Los Angeles metropolitan areas. Lash

received his Bachelors of Music from the Colburn Conservatory of Music, where he studied with Ronald Leonard. He completed Master of Music and Doctorate degrees at the USC Thornton School of Music, where he studied with Ralph Kirshbaum.
